Re: Designation of High Pedestrian Traffic Area – University of North Carolina Greensboro

At the request of University Administrators, Department staff have reviewed a group of streets in the vicinity of the University for designation as a High Pedestrian Area. Article V, Division 1, Section 16-227 authorizes the Director of Transportation to prohibit the operation of bicycles and micromobility vehicles on sidewalks located in high pedestrian traffic areas.

## **Request**

The area requested for consideration included all City streets between:

- Friendly Avenue to the north,
- Mendenhall Street, Fulton Street and Freeman Mill Road to the east,
- Hertford Street and Trogdon Street to the south, and
- Coliseum Drive, Chapman Street, Warrant Street Sylvan Street, Arden Street and Overbrook Street to the west.

## **Designation**

Based on the current boundaries of the University campus, availability of on street facilities and micromobility use patterns, the following area is designated as a High Pedestrian Traffic Area:

- Market Street to the north,
- Tate Street to the east,
- Haywood Street to the south, and
- Josephine Boyd to the west.

Staff will continue to monitor activity within the additional requested areas for future consideration.
